

**IN MEMORIAM  
DANIEL J. LEINHEISER**



We regret to advise all of the passing of Daniel Leinheiser on December 27, 2019 at age 78. Dan retired from Urban in 2011 after 30 years with the firm and almost 50 years in the engineering field. He had a long and accomplished career highlighted by his leadership of the Urban's highway design group. He had extensive experience in leading the design efforts on major interstate highways and arterial and local roads on new or existing alignments, and was particularly strong in the management of design teams. Under his stewardship, the firm delivered transformational transportation projects for PennDOT and the Pennsylvania Turnpike, including high-profile sections of the Blue Route, I-95, SR 1 Phase II in Delaware, and many others. He earned his Bachelors degree in civil engineering at Villanova University and was a member of our Section for many years. He was a registered professional engineer in four states.

Dan was known for his focus on quality and attention to detail, while always being fair and honest with co-workers and clients, qualities that can be found today in the many engineers at Urban that he mentored. Many in the Urban family routinely sought his advice and guidance. He helped build the firm's brand and legacy. The Urban family will miss a great engineer, leader, and friend.

Dan is survived by his wife, Agnes, daughter Karen (husband Bill), son Michael (wife Katie), and three grandchildren. Memorial donations may be made in his memory to St. Joseph's Villa, 110 Wissahickon Avenue, Flourtown, PA 19031.

**ROBERT M. KOERNER, PhD, PE**

It is with heavy hearts that we announce the death of Bob Koerner on December 1, 2019. at age 85. He was born to immigrant parents and grew up in Lansdowne. He earned his Bachelor's degree from Drexel University in 1956, his combined Master's degree from Columbia, Delaware and Drexel Universities in 1963, and his Ph.D. in Civil Engineering from Duke University in 1968.



Bob began his career in construction and worked on several notable projects including the Walt Whitman Bridge and the Cross Bronx Expressway/I-95 in New York City. After three near fatal accidents on the job, his wife Paula convinced him that she didn't want to raise their three young children as a widow, so he needed to find a safer career. He transitioned into teaching at the Pennsylvania Military College (now Widener University) and then moved to North Carolina to pursue his Ph.D. at Duke.

Bob returned to our area in 1968 to join the Civil Engineering Department at Drexel University. His initial research was on deep foundations, acoustic emission monitoring of soil deformations, and nondestructive testing to locate below-ground structures and objects. In the late 1970's he began research in the fledgling field of designing and installing fabrics and polymers in roadways and retaining walls. In 1980, he co-authored the first textbook on geosynthetics, and the "phone never stopped ringing". With his full and complete focus on geosynthetics, he became renowned in the field, in the US and internationally, and is known for over 700 publications, most notably the text "Designing with Geosynthetics," which was recently updated with its 6th edition. In 1986, he founded the Geosynthetic Research Institute (GRI) to support the growing industry of geosynthetic education and research. It was tremendously successful as it was shaped by federal, state, and private research interests. This was the foundation of what was to become the Geosynthetic Institute (GSI).

In 1998 Bob was elected into the National Academy of Engineering. He proudly served the local, national, and international engineering community for over 50 years. While he was not a member of our Section, we knew and worked with him well. He is survived by his sons Michael (wife Mary) and George (wife Jamie), daughter Pauline Limberg (husband Douglas), and his six grandchildren. His wife Pauline unfortunately passed away in early December.

**NEPA:** The Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) has proposed changes to NEPA. If members are interested in providing comment, comments are due by March 10, 2020. The proposed rule can be found here: <https://www.govinfo.gov/content/pkg/FR-2020-01-10/pdf/2019-28106.pdf>.

**NPDES NOI Permitting Update:** On February 14, PennDOT Central Office (CO) released guidance to the Districts on how to adapt to the December 8, 2019 revised PAG-02 NPDES NOI form. NOI changes impact both the application, documentation, and calculation methodologies. In the future, CO anticipates subsequent follow up with directions regarding calculation approach as the two agencies assess applicability to PennDOT projects.

**Threatened or Endangered Species:** On January 13, 2020, PennDOT released an updated version of its Publication 546, the "Threatened and Endangered Species Desk Reference" (Rev. 5). ## Members in Transportation/Transition

### Lloyd Recognized for Outstanding Service

The Delaware Valley Engineers Week Committee of the Engineers' Club of Philadelphia proudly recognized Herman W. Lloyd for his Outstanding Service to Engineering. This award was presented to Herman at the Engineers Week Opening Ceremony on February 13, where Section President Alexa Egan Harper, a member of the Engineers Week Committee, presented the award (photo at right).

Herman recently joined Traffic Planning & Design, Inc., as a Vice President, where he focuses on further expansion of the firm's Philadelphia presence, continuation of relationships with current clients, pursuit of new clients and relationships, and leadership of diversity and inclusion (D & I) efforts. He comes to TPD following an 11-year career as a Senior Vice President, and the Chief Diversity & Inclusion Officer at Johnson, Mirmiran and Thompson (JMT), at which he opened its Philadelphia office in 2007 and increased the firm's presence to over 115 employees and more than 10 different disciplines.

Herman began his career in the AEC industry more than 50 years ago, during a time when diversity was not valued as it is today, starting in 1962 as a Construction Inspector at the Pennsylvania Department of Highways (PDH), now the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT). During his 29-year career with the State, he rose through the ranks in the District 6-0 Construction Unit to Assistant District Construction Engineer. He retired from PennDOT in January 1991, and he is still the only African American to ever serve in the position of Assistant District Construction Engineer. Following his retirement, he spent 28 years at two local consulting engineering and construction management firms.

Herman's prior professional organization leadership accomplishments include service as President (1998-99) and as a Board Member for our Section and a Board Member for Pennsylvanians for Transportation Solutions (PenTrans). He has been a strong supporter of the Women's Transportation Seminar organization since his introduction to the group in 2007 and was selected as one of the first WTS Philadelphia Chapter Advisory Board Members. He is a Past Chair for the prestigious Philadelphia March of Dimes Transportation, Building and Construction Awards Luncheon, having served as Chair of the event in 2016 and 2017.

Herman also serves as a trusted advisor for the Philadelphia Chapter of the Conference of Minority Transportation Officials and he received the 2015 COMTO Executive of the Year Award. He is a member of the ACEC/PA Diversity & Inclusion Committee and is a member of the ACEC-DPC Diversity & Inclusion Working Group. He is also a close associate with the Chamber of Commerce for Greater Philadelphia's Diversity & Inclusion Committee, currently working with the Supplier Diversity Roundtable.

Herman holds a bachelor's degree from Eastern University in Organizational Management, and an associate degree in Civil Engineering from Delaware County Community College. On the personal side, he is a life-long member of Calvary Baptist Church in West Philadelphia, where he serves on its Board of Directors. He and his wife, Mattie, have been married more than 57 years, and have four children, along with a host of grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

We congratulate Herman on this esteemed honor.

### Gormley Selected as Delaware Valley Young Engineer

Section Member **Jesse Gormley** has been selected as the 2020 Delaware Valley Young Engineer of the Year. He was officially recognized and "installed" at the Engineers Week Opening Ceremony on February 13. He serves as a Project Structural Engineer and Manager with Pennoni at the firm's headquarters in Center City. He has been with Pennoni for the past twelve years, starting as a co-op student and returning as a full-time engineer following his graduation from Drexel University in 2010 with both his Bachelor of Science in Architectural Engineering and Master of Science in Civil Engineering degrees, with Magna Cum Laude honors. He specializes in bridge and structural design, inspection and load rating analysis for bridges, and design of retaining walls and related earth-retention structures. Among his recent projects are the Crum Creek Viaduct replacement on SEPTA's Media Elwyn Regional Rail line, the replacement of overhead structures on the Vine Street Expressway in Center City, and the award-winning Lock Street bridge spanning the Manayunk Canal in northwest Philadelphia.



Jesse is a member and supporter of several professional organizations and institutes, including the Engineers' Club of Philadelphia, American Society of Civil Engineers, Pennsylvania Society of Professional Engineers, Structural Engineering Institute, and Women's Transportation Seminar. He is most active in the ASCE Philadelphia Section, where he has been a Board member for the Younger Member Forum (YMF) since 2011 in a variety of capacities and is proud to currently be serving as Forum President. His crowning achievement during his YMF tenure, though, remains the co-founding of the Chester A. Arthur Civil Engineering Club in South Philadelphia in 2012. The Club, which was the first in Pennsylvania and the first club nationally to work with middle school students, is currently in its eighth year and has seen over 60 students participate in the weekly afterschool program to learn about all the various disciplines of civil engineering. He is also active at the National level of ASCE on its Committee on Younger Members (CYM).

Jesse is passionate about student outreach and increasing public awareness of the engineering professions. He strives to have students realize the diverse opportunities available in the STEM fields. In addition, to the Civil Engineering Club, Jesse has organized numerous outreach events at local schools, reaching hundreds of students. Most recently, he began a partnership with the new Science Leadership Academy Middle School in West Philadelphia to lead a six-week, project-focused mini-course to 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders, on behalf of Pennoni. He has written about these experiences and given presentations to both ASCE and ECP members on best practices for STEM outreach.

Jesse feels fortunate to have very supportive family and friends. His mother is a teacher and was especially encouraging of his interest in the STEM-related classes, finding unique ways to work science and math into his childhood, particularly through cooking. He is especially appreciative of his wife, Christina, and daughter, Sadie, for all the opportunities and support they have provided him. He is especially thankful for the influences in his life from his mother, Nancie, who unfortunately passed away a few weeks before he was honored as the Young Engineer of the Year. He gave a fitting and touching tribute to her guidance and support in his introductory remarks at the Engineers Week Opening Ceremony.


