

We regret to advise that John (Jack) Seber passed away peacefully on September 21 at the age of 88. Mr. Seber was an active member of our Section and served in several capacities over the years including Section President (1989-90), Board member, and chair of our Career Awareness Committee for several years.

Mr. Seber was born in Ridley Park Hospital and grew up in Chester. He earned his Bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering from Villanova University. He held Professional Engineer ilicenses in Pennsylvania, Delaware, and the U.S. Virgin Islands, a testament to his dedication and expertise in the field.

Mr, Seber devoted much of his career to public service through his work at PennDOT, followed by roles in private engineering firms including Conceptual Engineering and Czop Specter. He also served as Township Engineer for Limerick Township, where his work left a lasting impact on the community.

Mr. Seber is survived by his loving wife of 60 years, Ruth (Walker) Seber; his children, John Seber Jr. and his wife Yvonne (Yerger), Maria (Seber) Blanco and her husband Ricardo Blanco, and Jennifer (Seber Garris) Wall and her husband David Wall. He was a proud grandfather of six. He is also remembered fondly by many cousins and extended family members.

A private graveside service was held for family and friends at Limerick Garden of Memories on October 3. A funeral mass and celebration of life will be held in the spring, with the date to be announced.

Mr. Seber will be remembered for his quiet strength, sharp mind, and unwavering commitment to his family and profession. His legacy lives on in the roads he helped build, the lives he touched, and the family he cherished.



Environmentally Speaking...

The Pennsylvania Association of Environmental Professionals (PAEP) turns 40!!!

And what better way to celebrate than at the 2025 PAEP Annual Conference! Held from September 10-12 in State College, the PAEP Annual Conference offered the opportunity to exchange ideas and information, analyze current trends to help expand knowledge bases, make new connections, and stay informed and prepared for the future. In the ever-changing environmental regulatory climate, the conference provided a one-stop shop on a diverse range of topics that environmental professionals face each day.

Informational sessions included PADEP Chapter 105 Waterways and Wetlands Program updates, which provided an overview of upcoming changes to PASGPG7, discussed the 105 Regulation Revision Reboot, offered insight to the Streamlining Permits for


Economic Expansion and Development (SPEED) Program, and encouraged participation in the PA Clean Water Academy; and a separate presentation on Environmental Justice in the Commonwealth.

Representatives from PennDOT BPDD discussed changes to Drainage Design and Related Procedures (DM Part 2 – Highway Design, Chapter 10); cultural resources coordination with the National Parks Service; and changes in the reviews of T&E species, specifically with regard to bats from a PennDOT project perspective. USACE provided insight into recent federal regulatory updates with a focus on the latest developments with the Clean Water Act and Endangered Species Act listings.

The PA Turnpike shared about their project to reestablish pollinator habitat along its 565 miles of vegetated ROW in support of an effort to become America's first Sustainable Superhighway by 2040. Consultants provided information on how to navigate the recent changes in the NEPA regulations; shared aquatic resource mitigation that was conducted for unavoidable impacts to wetlands and streams as a result of a transportation improvement project; instructed on how to identify and optimize appropriate and efficient bat survey methods; discussed the role of renewables in the North American energy market; and presented on the use of vulnerability assessments as a tool to a more coordinated and data-informed approach to hazard mitigation. Other sessions included an inside look at how the removal of aquatic barriers, such as redundant dams, can help to revive rivers and offer community benefits; Stage Zero Stream Restoration; and an overview of the draft MS4 General Permit, released in January 2025, and how it incentivizes intergovernmental collaboration.

Donna Prentice Memorial Scholarship Competition - Now Open for Submissions

Our Section's Scholarship Program has been benefitting local college students since 1972. We have had one of the largest such efforts among ASHE Sections nationally over the years. Many recipients have gone on to positions in the industry, both locally and out of the area, and a number have gone on in their professional careers to become members of ASHE.

Last season, interest continued to be "healthy", and the Scholarship Committee received a strong response, making 12 awards with a total value of \$17,000 We are hopeful that we will get similar interest and more applications this season. We are proud to be able to support our local future engineers and help them in their educational pursuits. The Scholarship Program has assisted numerous students over the years, and was renamed in honor of the late Donna Prentice, wife of long-time Section member Rich Prentice, in 2003.

The competition is now open, and applications are due by November 1. Please check our website for more information on this, as well as the application form (delvalley.ashe.pro). We strongly encourage students to apply (and ask parents to let their college-age children know about this opportunity!).

Additionally, repeating what was begun last year, we will be funding a Student Scholarship that will be awarded as part of the Delaware Valley Engineers Week celebration (see page 3). More information is available on the Engineers' Club of Philadelphia website (www.engrclub.org).

At our 29th Annual Golf Outing, conducted on May 19, the net proceeds realized, nearly \$10,000, will be directed to the Scholarship Fund as in years past.

Successful Scholarship candidates will be notified in January and invited to attend our February Section Meeting to be honored in person. We look forward to a strong response from local students for this program.

Future City - Help Needed ...

The Future City Competition is a project-based learning program for 6th through 8th grade students that introduces them to the principles of engineering while allowing them to use teamwork and creativity to solve problems that face the world. The program helps advance STEM learning in Middle Schools in our region and encourages students to consider careers in engineering. In recent years the regional competition has grown to include over 500 participating students and teachers in the Philadelphia area. This is a great way to give back to the community and share your experience with the next generation of engineers!



Mentors needed- If you have any time available to share your experience with students who are learning about what engineers and planners do, please consider volunteering. Mentors work with a student team to advise them as they build their model and prepare for the competition.

Flexible time commitment - The schools in need of mentors could use any help you can offer. There are plenty of ways to help including Zoom/Teams or corresponding via email.

Schedule - Schools are currently working toward their first deliverables in mid-December. The competition will be held in on January 26, 2026 at Archbishop Carroll High School.
