

Section Members Honored During Delaware Valley Engineers Week

As you may be aware Engineers Week in Delaware Valley was celebrated for the 74th consecutive year as part of National Engineers Week (February 19-28 locally, February 22-28 nationally). Two members of our Section were specifically honored as part of our local celebration and were recognized at the Engineers Week Opening Ceremony on February 19.



As previously reported, Section Director **Sarah McInnes** was introduced and inducted as the 2026 Delaware Valley Engineer of the Year at the Opening Ceremony. Sarah was nominated for this honor by our Section along with the support and co-sponsorship of the American Society of Civil Engineers, Philadelphia Section, and the ASCE Delaware Valley Geoinstitute (DVGI). She is pictured at left, accepting her official citation/certificate from Angelo Waters of the Delaware Valley Engineers Week Council.

Sarah serves as the Senior Assistant Construction Engineer, Construction Services for PennDOT District 6. In this role, she oversees a large staff of 55 and a multifaceted program that includes construction project delivery, structure control, materials, consultant agreements, surface treatment, constructability and schedule review, and project closeout. As part of her current leadership role, she is directly responsible for one of the largest staffs at District 6 and for hiring and mentoring staff and engineers for the Construction Unit. Previously, she served as the District Geotechnical Engineer for over 13 years, managing both in-house staff and consultant agreements to deliver geotechnical engineering services across the District. She implemented new geotechnical technologies and asset management strategies that improved project delivery and reduced long-term maintenance costs. She began her career at PennDOT in 1997.

Additionally, the Engineers Week Outstanding Service Award was presented to Jeffrey D. Guzy, PE, for his service to Engineering and the Community. Jeff retired in 2025 after a 42-year career in the local civil engineering transportation industry, which began with Greiner at its King of Prussia office shortly after his graduation from Johns Hopkins University in 1983. Over the years he has built an enviable professional legacy contributing to improving the Delaware Valley's transportation infrastructure, mastering early on the art of multi-discipline collaboration with fellow engineers and scientists in support of PennDOT District 6, the Delaware River Port Authority, and Montgomery County infrastructure projects. Throughout the 1980's and 1990's he honed his skills and began building his reputation for maintaining focus, promoting interdisciplinary cooperation, and quality, an inspiring legacy that includes delivering some of the larger, more complex infrastructure projects in the Philadelphia region.

This continued through the acquisition of Greiner by URS in 1996, with Jeff's tasks expanding to encompass and integrate the firm's Northeast and Mid-Atlantic offices and to reinforce cooperative interdisciplinary work. Navigating these challenges successfully resulted in URS becoming known as one of the premier transportation consulting firms in Pennsylvania. Concurrently, his reputation for technical expertise and guidance, mentorship of junior engineers, operations management, and client satisfaction continued to grow.

In 2015, Jeff looked to new challenges and accepted a position to guide RK&K's growth in the transportation sector in Pennsylvania, Delaware, and West Virginia. With the help of his respected and well-known transportation professional colleagues steering their respective disciplines, he navigated strategic teaming opportunities and delivery of high-quality projects to PennDOT, the PA Turnpike Commission, the City of Philadelphia, and other agencies.

Throughout his professional tenure, Jeff has been a contributing member of the Engineers' Club of Philadelphia, ASHE Delaware Valley, ACEC, SWEP, and other professional organizations. He found time to spearhead efforts undertaken by the Greater Valley Forge Transportation Management Association (GVFTMA), starting as a Board Member in 2003 and rising through the ranks to ultimately become President of the organization. He helped to guide the TMA's mission to improve quality of life through transportation demand management programs and policies. He remained as President until 2024. Recognizing that one's success is tied directly to mentors and colleagues who impart a strong sense of community, he has continually sought opportunities to convey his experience and expertise to our engineering community.

We proudly congratulate Sarah and Jeff on their well-deserved honors.

The individual awards are presented each year to candidates who reside or is employed in Delaware County or southern Chester County, and are evaluated according to professional achievement and contributions to community.






Future City Competition - Our Section's Award Winner Is...

As we have done for many years, our Section was proud to support the Future City Competition - Philadelphia once again, where we offered our Section's Transportation Infrastructure Award at the final judging/awards event held at Archbishop Carroll High School on January 24. The annual competition featured 45 middle schools teams from the greater Philadelphia area, with each school having a team of students imagining and presenting a future city that thinks about and addresses ways to tackle the problems of today and the future. This year's theme was Farm to Table.



After the judges' inspection of the entrants, a not-so-easy decision (considering the caliber of candidate cities) was made to cite the Seven Generations Charter School from Emmaus, PA, with our Section's special award. The School's city model is pictured at left. In the opinion of the judges, the proposed city had a great approach on how it connected and how people and goods were able to move around, all while addressing issues that we know of today that can be improved upon for the future.

Donna Prentice Memorial Scholarship Competitions - Awards Made!

We have been able to conduct our Section’s Scholarship Program for 54 years (starting in 1972) and it has become one of the largest among ASHE Sections nationally over the years. It has been continually benefitting local college students, and many recipients have gone on to positions in the industry, both locally and out of the area, with a number becoming members of ASHE.

Last season was a very successful one for scholarships with a total of \$17,000 in awards being spread among 12 candidates. This season was, by comparison, lighter, with 5 students sharing \$10,000 in scholarship funds. The successful applicants, listed below, were invited as our guests at our February Section Dinner Meeting to be duly recognized and presented with their awards, but unfortunately none of them were able to attend the meeting.

Environmentally Speaking...

Environmental Justice remains a priority for Pennsylvania

In January 2025, Executive Order (EO) 14173, Ending Illegal Discrimination and Restoring Merit-Based Opportunity, revoked EO 12898, Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations. As a result, the consideration of impacts on Environmental Justice (EJ) communities is no longer required at the federal level. However, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has its own EJ policy, and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) continues to prioritize EJ. At the 2025 PAEP conference, representatives of PADEP explained Pennsylvania's approach to EJ and how projects can continue to follow the Commonwealth's EJ policies.

Recent efforts by PADEP to promote the value of EJ include the appointment of a new Special Deputy of Environmental Justice; addition of Environmental Justice Regional Coordinators in each of PADEP's six regions; publishing of an Interim Final Environmental Justice Policy (2023) and the PennEnviroScreen mapping tool; and development of a proactive community outreach and engagement program. These initiatives advance the state's EJ goals, consistent with the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Environmental Rights Amendment, which states "people have a right to clean air, pure water, and the preservation of the natural, scenic historic and aesthetic values of the environment." The efforts are also consistent with Pennsylvania EO 2021-07, which "aims to ensure all Pennsylvanians, particularly disadvantaged communities, are meaningfully involved in environmental decision-making" and outlines recommended activities that executive branch agencies can take to further EJ goals.

The Pennsylvania EJ policy's focus areas include: Proactive Community Engagement; Enhanced Public Participation; Inspections, Compliance, and Enforcement; Community Development and Investment; and Climate Initiatives. Enhanced Public Participation may be requested by community members or by regulatory staff for any project and associated permits, authorizations, or approvals. The [PennEnviroScreen](#) tool is a valuable resource for identifying areas where vulnerable communities could potentially be impacted by transportation improvement projects, such as new roadway alignments or widening, bridge replacements, interchange construction, etc.
